JUNE MEETING

Storage of bisque and glazed work has been looked at. Members glazed work is now being stored on the new shelves in the library/office area. Check regularly that your work has been fired and ready to pick up, and that work in progress is completed in a timely manner and moved to the shelves in the kiln room for bisque firing.

Members are asked to be vigilant when exiting from the toilet as the door sometimes does not close and lock properly. Within a short period of time the door will lock. Double check the door.

New scales have been purchased for weighing pots when submitting them for firing. There is a separate scale for bisque (\$5 per kg) and another set of scales for glaze firing (\$7.50 per kg). Please complete the spreadsheet and payment slips with all your details and deposit funds into the kiln account to cover your firing costs.

There are concerns with glazed work being doubled dipped and pots are covered with too much glaze which is resulting in the glaze running off the pots and onto the kiln shelves during firing. The kiln technician has recommended that if pots need to be double dipped that members only double dip the rims and to decant glaze into a separate container before dipping second glaze, so as to not contaminate the entire bucket of glaze. If members are unsure about glazing please ask for advice before glazing pots. Remember to wipe all glaze from the base of your pots and the lower edge near the base so the glaze does not adhere your pot to the kiln shelf during firing.

Members please note that on the inside of the kiln room door there are contact numbers to call if you have problems at the studio. Graham Longhurst is available to call if there are issues with your alarm code.

It's always fun and rewarding but we still need glazed bowls by the end of July delivered to the studio.
