EMPTY BOWLS

The Empty Bowls fundraising event for FoodBank is happening again in August. The South of the River Potters' Club has been a long-time supporter of the Empty Bowls project and we encourage all of our members to get involved once again this year. Every year our members, together with potters from all over WA, create soup bowls to be donated to the Empty Bowls project and sold at their fundraising event for FoodBank in August.

It's a wonderful project and a great way for you to practice your skills at making soup bowls. The bowls that you make should be of a generous size to hold a big portion of hot, delicious soup. The Club subsidises the firing and glazing of your bowls and they should be clearly marked with 'EB' on the base and logged as 'EB' when you weigh them and submit them for firing. The standard of bowls being donated in past years has been very high and many guests at the lunch event in August have bought several extra bowls to take home and treasure - so that's your challenge! It's always fun and rewarding but we need to start now because the bowls need to be delivered by the end of July and that is not very far away!

The big bonus for our Club is that we get to have a stall at the Empty Bowls event at Christ Church Grammar School where members can offer pots for sale. This has been quite successful in past years and it is a great exposure for the Club.
