Guidelines for website submission:

• You will have your own page in the Members' Gallery section of the website. This means that you can circulate the web address of this page as your personal web page if you wish. eg: https://sorpottersclub.com/members-gallery/yourname

- Include a paragraph or two of information about yourself and your work. Feel free to include links to your website or Facebook page or an email address. (Check the website to see what others have written.)
- Preferably include at least one photo that clearly shows your face, preferably at work on a pot.
- The pictures will have square format when posted keep that in mind when composing your photos.
- File size up to about 500Mb. The photos of your work should clear and well lit.
- Photos are displayed in rows of three, so it is suggested that you submit multiples of three eg. 6, 9, to a maximum of 12

LIBRARY

Several new donations have been made to the Club library by Elizabeth Miocevich Turner including copies of two excellent journals – Ceramics Technical and Art and Perception. Our librarian, Tracy-Lee, has updated the library catalogue and it is an impressive and comprehensive collection of pottery resources, many of them out of print.

The library is accessible in the room behind our meeting room and it's just a matter of signing out any books that you borrow. The catalogue is available on the website, including a searchable Excel spreadsheet version.

KARLUP-ATWELL CERAMIC STUDIO

A slight hitch in the progress of construction of our new facility has been a review of the costs which meant that it had to go back to Council for approval but this is expected to be routine. Meanwhile the builder has been selected and is waiting for the go-ahead.

Progress is also underway on the planning for a new Atwell Gallery building. The architects have completed a wonderful design including a café and it has been costed by Council. Negotiations are also underway to improve access to the Atwell House site from Canning Highway and the signage at the front of the property will soon be upgraded so that it is clearly visible from both traffic directions.
