RECYCLED CLAY

Tracey-Lee, Cezarne and numerous helpers continue the onerous work of recycling clay for all members to use. The clay is located in a plastic bin near the pug mill in the studio and is available for purchase for \$3 a bag (approx. 2kg). An honesty system is being used for payments - just fill in one of the forms and drop it into the firing payments box in the glaze room . Make a note of your name and the bag number/s in the recycled clay log.Payments should be made to the Club General Account (see Page 1).


ALBANY RETREAT
