Pit Firing - to be held at Chris Rogers' place in July. Time to start preparing some pots!



Glaze Development and Reduction Firing

This is a week-long workshop being held at Happs Pottery in Dunsborough. The 5 day Glaze workshop is to encourage ceramic enthusiast to understand glazes and the development process involved to create their own glaze pallete. Not only that it is a complete comprehensive process to understand minerals and oxides and their workability. All information will be shared with guidelines & documentation followed with two reduction firings.
