KARLUP STUDIO UPDATES

All air conditioning is now working manually. The controller in each area or room can be turned on and off manually – just don't forget to turn it off when you leave the building.

There is a double exhaust fan switch in the Wet Room, marked for the Kiln Room and for the Wet Room. The Kiln Exhaust switch MUST NEVER be touched – it is only to be used by the kiln technician and other authorised kiln operators.

Kiln Room modifications will soon be made so that there is a temperature sensor on the fans and a fume hood to better capture heat and fumes from the kilns

The spray booth is now located outside the kiln room on the verandah and an additional wedging table has been refurbished.

Several members have donated glaze materials to the Club and these are currently being catalogued and sorted by Elaine Bradley. Particular thanks go to Eve Gellatly for her generous donation which includes a large quantity of excellent stains and underglazes.
