EMPTY BOWLS EVENT



Empty Bowls is a fundraising project in support of FoodBank. It is part of an international movement whereby potters create generously sized soup bowls which are donated to the event and are sold, full of delicious soup, at a lunchtime event in August at Christchurch Grammar School. Last year the event raised \$16,000 for Foodbank. The SORPC has participated in this event for several years and last year our members contributed 50 bowls. We have been invited to participate again this year and, once again, we will also be able to have a stall to sell our pots to those attending. Space will be limited so priority will be given to members who have contributed bowls.

The Club is supporting this effort by providing firing and glazing for your bowls. A bisque firing will be loaded on Friday July 2nd, glazing session on Wednesday July 14th after the meeting and a Cone 6 glaze firing on Friday July 16th.

If each of us produces 5 bowls, we can easily exceed last year's contribution – what a great motivation to practice your wheel skills!!! My production is underway – how is yours going?


RAKU FIRING DAY

KARLUP-ATWELL STUDIO PROGRESS

The latest news on the construction of our new studio is that building work is due to begin in July and that the current deadline for completion is December $10^{\rm th}$.

Meanwhile work is going ahead on organising some of the furniture and fittings for the building. A \$25,000 grant has been received from the Department of Arts and Culture, organised by local member, Lisa O'Malley, prior to the State election. Part of this grant money has been earmarked for the purchase of a new kiln to replace the aged KilnWest kiln and the balance is being put towards tables and chairs and a ware trolley for the work room and teaching space in the new building.
