Mocha diffusion is a highly decorative technique with a long history in traditional British pottery. **Barbara Reeve** and **Eve Gellatly** will conduct a demonstration workshop to show you the tricks and techniques involved in this fascinating process and guide you to try the technique with some of your own pots. KILNS

The KilnWest kiln is showing it's age and it has been decided that it will no longer be used for 1280° firings.

When evaluating the results of your glaze firings, if some of the results were not as you had wished, please remember to think about some of the many variables that can trip us all up —

• Were the pots absolutely free of dust before glazing?

- Was the glaze appropriate for that firing temperature?
- Was the glaze a good match for the clay?
- Was the thickness of application an issue?

There are so many variables in our craft and when things go wrong we can learn a lot by reviewing our techniques. Don't forget that there is a wealth of knowledge and experience within our membership so don't be shy about asking for advice. Or bring your 'oopsies' along to a meeting and we can all benefit from figuring out what went wrong and how to fix it next time.
