EMPTY BOWLS

REMINDER: The Empty Bowls fundraising event for FoodBank is happening again in August. The South of the River Potters' Club has been a long-time supporter of the Empty Bowls project and we encourage all of our members to get involved once again this year. Several members have already produced bowls which is fantastic, and they are currently going through the bisque firings.

Remember that the bowls should be of a generous size (don't forget to allow for shrinkage) and should hold at least 1½ cups of soup.

The deadline for submission of the bowls is the end of July which is not very far away! The Club subsidises the firing and glazing of your bowls and they should be clearly marked with 'EB' carved into the base and logged as 'EB' when you weigh them and submit them for firing.

The big bonus for our Club is that we get to have a stall at the Empty Bowls event at Christ Church Grammar School where members can offer pots for sale. This has been quite successful in past years and it is a great exposure for the Club.



CLAY RECYCLING TEAM

Barbara Wheater and Tracy-Lee van den Bergh are coordinating the recycling and pugging of clay in the studio. They are very keen to hear from you if you can join their team to help with this task regularly. So far the sales of recycled clay have raised valuable funds for the Club. FIRED WORK COLLECTION

There are heaps of bisqued pots in the store room awaiting collection and space is very limited because many of the shelves are taken up with students' work from the classes. Please collect your bisqued pots promptly as there will be a limit to how long they can be stored at the studio.



In future, <u>glazed</u> pots will be kept in the kiln room after firing, so check the shelf closest to the kiln room door if you have pots coming through the glaze firings.
