The kilns have been working overtime in the past month and Graham has been there night and day to make sure that everyone's pots were fired in time for the Glorious Mud exhibition. Thanks Graham!!!!!!

A Covid-Safe QR check-in code has been placed in the kiln room but please also fill in the attendance book on the desk.

The new procedure for kiln firing payments is operational and the new account has been set up for kiln firing payments:

a/c Name:- Kiln Firing

Anyone wishing to take part may deposit money into this account, giving their name and stating the amount, with a notification of the deposit to

You will not be able to share in future firings without the deposit having been done and being kept in credit.

Deposits of \$20- \$30- \$40 or \$50 can be made into the account, depending on how much you think you will use it. This will be reconciled at the end of every month and money will be removed from your credit to pay for your firings.

Those people who regularly fire the kiln themself may continue to deposit the full cost of their firing fee within 10 working days noting which firing they are paying for (no change to current procedure - just deposit to this new bank a/c number).
